Caring for our Permanent Collection

Our curatorial team has been working hard over the past several months carrying out an inventory of our Permanent Collection, photographing objects and performing conservation treatments. This important work was necessary to prepare the Collection for its move and storage during the Museum's major construction phase.

Ensuring the safety and security of the Collection is critical during this transition. We are pleased to be working with a few organizations that will store our Collection in secure and climate-controlled environments. In addition, we are collaborating with a number of community partners such as Western Carolina University and branches of State Employees' Credit Union and Wells Fargo to present works on view to the public.
